

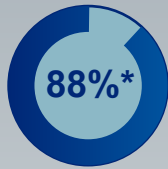


South West London STP: preventing alcohol-related harm

- ✓ Market alcohol treatment services, ensure robust pathways to treatment including the adoption of www.mecclink.co.uk as a pan-London online directory
- ✓ Minimise the impact of alcohol on the most vulnerable including children of dependent drinkers
- ✓ Establish well-resourced Alcohol Care Teams for every hospital
- ✓ Increase the number of dependent drinkers receiving treatment
